

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP FOR THE 2026/2027 ACADEMIC YEAR

1. Purpose of the Scholarship

The primary purpose of the National Higher Education Scholarship is to support and recognize students enrolled in state-funded/state-scholarship-supported, as well as fee-paying/self-funded, full-time bachelor's, master's, and integrated degree programs, in order to maintain a high standard of academic and professional performance. The scholarship may be awarded to students who achieved outstanding academic results in the 2025/2026 academic year, performed exceptionally well in their professional field, and engaged in exemplary community, sports, cultural, or other activities.

2. Eligible Applicants

Students at the University of Miskolc who are enrolled in a state-funded/state-scholarship program or a self-funded/tuition-paying program in a full-time bachelor's, master's, or integrated degree program are eligible to apply for the scholarship. Students who are completing their bachelor's degree in June and intend to continue their studies in a master's program in September—i.e., students changing degree levels—are also eligible to apply. An additional requirement for the scholarship is that the student has been enrolled for at least two semesters during their studies, maintained a minimum weighted GPA of 4.00 in both the first and second semesters of the 2025/2026 academic year, and earned a total of at least 55 credit.

3. Duration, amount, and conditions of the scholarship

Duration of scholarship payments: The scholarship will be paid for 10 months during the 2026–2027 academic year

The amount of the scholarship: 40,000 HUF/month

The scholarship awarded may only be disbursed during the academic year for which it was applied for; disbursement is contingent upon the recipient maintaining active student status during the semester

4. Criteria for evaluating the application

We will evaluate the submitted proposals based on a point system. We distinguish between three main categories when awarding points:

- I. Studies
- II. Professional Activities
- III. Public life, sports, and other activities

Submission of the application

Deadline for submitting applications: Monday, July 6, 2026, 12:00 p.m.

Where to submit the application: The Dean's Office of the faculty responsible for the program.

Formal requirements for submitting the application:

The application must be submitted to the Dean's Office of the Faculty in two copies—one original and one copy—in two separate unsealed A4 envelopes, addressed to the Minister of Higher Education.

- The following must be printed or typed on the envelopes:
 - Is it an “original” or a “copy”,
 - the applicant's name,
 - the applicant's Neptun ID,
 - what program is the applicant expected to be enrolled in during the first semester of the 2026/2027 academic year (bachelor's program, master's program, integrated program, name of the program),
 - the name of the applicant's faculty.
- All attachments submitted as part of the application must be numbered, and the attachments must be listed in the document summarizing the application attachments.

The Dean's Office will not accept the application if any of the following conditions are not met: The application form is missing,

- The summary sheet for the attachments is missing,
- The attachments have not been numbered,
- There are not two copies of the application documents available,
- The student's signature is missing from the application form and the summary sheet for the attachments

Upon submission of the application, the Dean's Office will confirm receipt of the documents by issuing a receipt or by affixing a receipt stamp to a copy of the application materials.

Once the application has been submitted, no additional information may be provided!

5. Required supporting documents

All documents required to substantiate the results, activities, and eligibility stated in the application must be attached, in particular:

- An application form completed by computer and signed by the applicant.

- A list of the documents, numbered in sequence and signed by the applicant.
- A copy of the course catalog for the first and second semesters of the 2025–2026 academic year, certified by the Center for Educational Strategy.
- Photocopies of certificates or documents attesting to the student’s language proficiency.
- A description of professional and academic activities, accompanied by brief comments and signatures from the individuals providing the references
- Demonstration activities, supported by a certificate signed by the department chair or institute director, which includes a factual list of the work performed (grading midterms, grading individual assignments, conducting laboratory sessions, participating in the preparation of teaching materials, etc.)
- A list of professional and academic publications (in order of authors, title, place of publication, date of publication, page numbers), along with photocopies of the publications and program booklets.
- Proof of the student’s participation in public, athletic, or other activities (membership cards, photocopies of documents certifying achievements), signed by the person issuing the proof and indicating their position.

Points may only be awarded for completed activities that are supported by documentation and were carried out between July 1, 2025, and June 30, 2026. Language exam results are an exception to this rule and are accepted without any time limit.

6. Evaluation of Applications

Applications will be ranked by the Faculty Academic Committee. Following the ranking, students will be able to view the order of recommended candidates on the University of Miskolc website on July 10, 2026. The Center for Educational Strategy is responsible for publishing the results.

During the review process, the Faculty Academic Committee may only consider academic results recorded in Neptun by July 7, 2026!
